- **BOLD** indicates the lead minister who, before the mass, sets up the credence table with the vessels, linen, water cruet and pitcher for Mass.
  - Eucharistic Ministers, go up to the altar at the start of the Lamb of God for communion distribution. When a deacon is present, one less Eucharistic minister is needed. When there is no deacon, the lead minister administers the cup to the other communion ministers.
  - After mass, the lead Eucharistic Minister returns the vessels, linen, water cruet and pitcher to the Sacristy. The lead minister also cleans the vessels and puts vessels and used linen in the proper places.
  - Remember, it is the responsibility of **all ministers** to find a replacement if you cannot be at your scheduled Mass.
