## Musings from the Pastoral Center by Fr. Paul

In celebrating the Feast of the Assumption, we find the beautiful hymn of praise and thanksgiving known as the *Manificat*. The response which our Blessed Mother gave to her cousin after Elizabeth had addressed her as the "mother of my Lord." This hymn is recited or sung at every Evening Prayer each day by priests, religious, and lay-people who recite the Divine Office. This hymn is an appropriate prayer of praise and thanksgiving for the "working part of our day" which has come to an end. Giving praise and glory to God and thanking God for giving us another day in which to love God and our neighbor. Also, to reflect on the individual and specifically designed mission God has given each of us as part of the Body of Christ.

This response from Mary is not an original hymn since various versions are found in the Old Testament, especially among woman. In I Samuel 1:2 to 2:10, Elkanah has two wives: Peninnah who bore him children; and Hannah who remained barren. After several years of praying for a child, Hannah finally bore a son and named him Samuel, which means "I have asked him from the Lord." In her request to God for at least a male child, Hannah promised to dedicate the son to the temple. After leaving Samuel at the temple, she praises and thanks God for the son with a hymn much longer than the *Manificat* (I Sam 2:1-10). The *Manificat* contains the same elements as in *The Song of Hannah*: praise, exultation, great deeds, honoring the faithful servant, victory over evil, generosity to those in need, and the fulfillment of the promise of a Messiah.

Later, in the Book of Esther, the captive Jewish people were in danger of being exterminated by the advisors and military force of King Ahasuerus (c. 460 B.C.E.) One of the Israelite men, Modecai, found favor in the king's court by saving the prime minister's life.

The disobedience of Queen Vashti, led Ahasuerus to replace her with Esther due to her beauty and courtly manners. Not only was she an Israelite but also the cousin of Modecai. Using her influence with the king, she managed to put an end to persecution and averted the extinction of her own people. In *Esther's Prayer*, Esther praises the Lord for all the goodness and blessings which had been bestowed upon the Israelites in the past. She prays for deliverance from the enemy (evil), begs the Lord to manifest himself to their captors, to continue being generous to the needy, and fulfill the promise given to Abraham.

There are several other women such as Sarah, Rachel, Rebekah, Deborah, and Jael, who play an important role in saving their people from extinction, fulfillment of God's promises, or bringing about the manifestation of God's goodness and blessings. The *Manificat* reminds us of the salvation ministry of Mary as the Mother of God. This reflection is being written on the feast of St. Clare of Assisi. With Poor Clares in almost every country in the world, with the one hour-time-differential among the world nations, the *Manificat* is recited each hour of the day. God being praised and thanked for the goodness and blessing which continually enter into our lives. Furthermore, the gratitude for a simple, young, and holy woman who said "Yes" to God in order to bring about the fulfillment of the "promise made to our ancestors, to Abraham and Sarah, and God's children forever."
