Musings from the Pastoral Center

As I read and reflected on the Gospel reading this weekend my mind started to ask a series of questions. Am I as a Christian on the inside or the outside of God's kingdom? Or to put it from a Protestant perspective; am I **SAVED**? Do I have a personal relationship with Jesus? For us as Catholics the term saved has little meaning, it is not used much in our circles. To be saved is to experience God's gift of salvation by experiencing and looking forward to sharing in the kingdom of God.

In the Gospel today Jesus is making his way to Jerusalem when he is asked; "Will only a few be saved?" He tells them it is difficult to enter through the narrow gate. The master will lock the door and people will knock to have it opened. The master will say 'I do not know you.'

Sometimes I wonder if many Catholics and Christians will be on the inside or the outside. What do I mean? I believe that being Catholic is a life long journey in a relationship with God. Many times I find that people, who have been raised in the faith, may attend Mass on Sunday, they may go to reconciliation once a year and they may be involved in some of the organizations of the Church, but somewhere in that lineup they fail in their relationship with God. They exist at that level of their faith where they are doing the things they believe a Christian must do. They know of Jesus, they know some of what the church teaches, and they know how to do many of the Catholic things, but will Jesus know them? Do they see Jesus in others and the world around them? Have they taken time to fall in love with the Lord? Do they have a relationship with Jesus so that they know him and he knows them?

Unfortunately as I look around there are many who fail in relationships, which shows in our involvement in the most important relationship of all - our relationship with God. I see this as I look at our country and find us struggling in our relationship with one another and in many areas of our world. In the past few years we have seen children suing parents for disciplining them, children killing other children in schools, marriages ending in divorce at a rate of over fifty percent. We have people needing to lock their doors and have walls around their property. As I was growing up we as a Catholic Church prayed for the western wall to come down. It did, but only twenty years later we find ourselves building great walls on our borders. We have people hating us as Americans enough to want to terrorize and kill us.

What seems to be the answer to these difficulties? If you take an earlier premises of mine that being Catholic is a life long journey in a relationship with God. I believe that we must begin by looking at our relationship with God. Jesus challenges the disciples to see that many people are trying to enter the gate, but they find that they are not able to enter into God's kingdom. Why? Because the master does not know them and they do not know the master. By developing and growing in our own relationship with God we grow in knowledge and love of God. To be on the inside of God's kingdom involves a profound trust that God is in control of our lives. We do this by living our lives not for ourselves but by giving God the credit for the person we are and all that we do. When we live our lives for God, then our pride and our ego is not at the front of who we are and we become one of God's servants. In becoming a servant we become not one of the first but one of the last. So as Jesus tells His disciples the last will be first and the first will be last. May we as a faith community strive to grow in our knowledge and love of the Lord so that when the Lord calls us we are able to enter through the narrow gate.
