Musings from the Pastoral Center

Faith is the realization of what is hoped for

Imagine living your whole life based on a promise. But the promise never materialized in your life. And then you passed that hope and belief onto the next generation, and still the promise never materialized. And the cycle repeated for generations. We would think these people were foolish. In our culture we live our lives based on facts and realities, not dreams and promises. Most of what we see and experience in our daily lives can be explained and predicted with great precision. We expect everything to be understood; ultimately there are no mysteries, miracles, or magic.

Our faith tradition is based on 'foolish' people just described. Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, the ancestors of the Chosen People, had faith that their children would be blessed with a homeland. We continue to pass that promise on to our children. We also embrace the belief that Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the hopes of our ancestors. We believe that Jesus came into the world to save us and offer a new hope, a new homeland, one that is eternal, one that is graced with God's presence and love. Like our ancestors, the reality of that hope is not so easy to capture and hold. But the life we live in faith of God's promises is a reality. That is a life that expresses compassion, mercy, forgiveness, healing and love.

Summer is beginning to wind down; in just a few weeks students will begin to return to school. Notice how our entire community is transformed by the start of a new school year: morning and afternoon students traveling, afternoon practices and events. Clearly, society devotes much time, energy, and resources to the education of children. Society uses schooling to instill knowledge, understanding, and a sense of objectivity in future generations.

Why? What is it that we hope for? A better life and a better tomorrow for our children. Mostly, our schools don't provide that kind education, because it falls into the category of mystery and faith and is very value laden. So, that subject is left to families and churches. The most important education we as Christian parents can impart to our children is an example of a life of faith and love. We need to demonstrate that we believe that we are loved, valued, and that our life is important. With faith we can live life more fully, with confidence, peace and joy. Then we show our children how to live our life beyond our life.

Theme: We must be ready for God to act in our lives at any time!

Question for Adults: On a daily basis, what are some ways to keep yourself "ready for God to act?" How do you pay attention to God's often-less-than-obvious actions?

Question for Youth: If Jesus were to knock on your door today and give you a report card on your life as His disciple, what grade would you get? Where would be your areas for improvement?

Question for Children: Jesus tells us to always be ready to hear him. What are some ways that he speaks to us?
