## Musings from the Pastoral Center by Fr. Paul

Ashland has become a Mecca for people in need. They seem to flock here from other towns, cities, and even other states. As most of you know, I volunteer at the Brick Ministries every Friday as much as I can. It has always been part of my ministerial understanding that direct outreach is important for my own spirituality and human understanding. Believe me, I do not do this for the public knowledge, but for a more selfish reason: "I need to keep my hands on the very ministry of Christ who walked the byways and was besieged by people with all kinds of needs." One day, volunteering at the Brick, allows one to see people who have more dignity than most of us. It takes a lot of gumption to seek help for the basics in life.

One of the Scriptural verses which comes to me each time I go to the Brick is "and he was moved with pity for the people." This verse, in the original Greek/Hebrew means that Jesus was moved from the "very innards of his body," "struck in the stomach," "shaken to his very being." In the fullness of Jesus' humanity, there was a compassion for God's people which overcame any revulsion, contempt, or self-protection from what we do not like. This was the final test for St. Francis of Assisi when he met the leper. The leper was his only stumbling block in reaching out to all people.

We need to be discreet when involved in out-reach. There are those who know how to work the system. Yet, as one of my friar colleagues always reminds me: "Paul, this is how one becomes when truly in need. It is necessary to find means to survive." As mentioned above, "the gumption to seek help" is often the means of surviving, the means of keeping one's dignity.

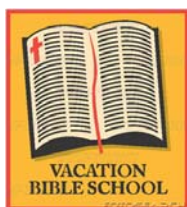
