Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Musings from the Pastoral Center by Fr. Paul

Meditating on these Scripture passages, one begins to make connections with what God is revealing to us and the realities of life and death. In the reading from II Corinthians, 5: 1, 6-10, we are reminded that “our earthly dwelling...destroyed” by death becomes “a dwelling from God, not made by hands, eternal ...” This passage confirms our faith and gives us hope in the love of God which becomes complete for us in the Resurrection.

In a recent funeral homily, I used the phrase: “now free from all earthly restraints...” It was the introduction to the fact that the deceased person had left this earth and now living in this “dwelling from God, not made of human hands.” Through the talents and gifts we have from God, we are able to create dwelling spaces for ourselves here on earth. Furthermore, we are able to bring about human life through procreation. Our baptisms in Christ, begins the transformation of sharing in both the human and divine life of Christ. Our destiny begins with the image of ourselves in God's mind, the “incarnation” of that image into our bodies, and the final stage of becoming “eternal in heaven.” Free from all human restraints: physical, mental, emotional and spiritual deficiencies.

This thought pattern led me to think that when we die we are with God. With God, we are freed from earthly restraints, yet with our earthly bodies as well. In the post-Resurrection experience of the disciples, Jesus visits with them in his body and continues to do “earthly things” like eating, walking, talking, etc. The difference for the disciples, which we can decipher by reading between the lines, is that this body had been “changed, not ended” (Preface I for funerals). Being free from earthly restraints gives our deceased loved ones so much more bodily energy, mental efficiency, and

spiritual depth. They are in a position to help us here on earth even more than before. We mourn our losses when our loved ones die. We handle our grief in our own personal ways. This is to be truly human as Jesus was, for he wept at the death of his friend Lazarus. It is our faith in the Resurrection, handed down from the experience of the disciples with the Resurrected Christ, which eventually brings us comfort and peace. Some day, we also will be living in "a dwelling from God, not made by hands, eternal ..."
