Holy Trinity Sunday

Musings from the Pastoral Center by Fr. Walter

I've been musing about the fact that we moved into liturgy's "Ordinary Time" – a designation given that period between the end of the Easter season and the beginning of the Advent. The Sundays during those two seasons have lofty themes around the key mysteries of those two seasons - the Incarnation and the Paschal Mystery. The themes of the liturgy of the Ordinary Time summon us to reflect on Our Lord in daily circumstances of his life.

This morning, I had to go downtown where I encountered a couple of ladies who are members of the O.L.L. faith community. Then I entered a business establishment and I had a conversation with a gentleman who is a customer service agent. After a little chitchat I gave him my address at our parish. Then he very proudly told me that he also is a Catholic and he went on to give me the name of the parish of which he's a part in another town. And I knew that to some extent he and I were kindred souls.

Within a matter of twenty minutes, I encountered ordinary Catholics in ordinary life circumstances, living amidst the mysteries of God. We function and operate in a world whose value is extraordinary because Jesus, in the mystery of the Incarnation became an integral part of it. We also function and operate in a world saved by Jesus by means of the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of the Lord. Without drum rolls or blaring trumpets these mysteries impact our daily lives, mysteries we share with our brothers and sisters in faith.

The events of Jesus' life are narrated in the Gospels and so we can go more deeply into the meaning of those events, we find their theological implications in the first readings of the day. It is ordinary that we live surrounded by mystery with others baptized as companions for the journey.

St. Agnes Cemetery and Shrine

It has been a slow and methodical process concerning the care of the cemetery and the Shrine. At this time, we need a small group of people to volunteer to maintain the daily needs of the Shrine. This includes opening & closing of the Shrine in the morning and evening, replacing the candles and removing the candle offerings daily, sweeping and possibly dusting on a regular basis. Since this is a 7-days a week ministry, a small group is needed so that not one person is committed every day of the week.

The cemetery care and maintenance is a ministry, a corporal works of mercy: "to bury the dead." Over the years, this ministry has become a professional industry that makes things easier for us. Funeral Directors facilitate the care, burial, and hosting both the visitation times and the liturgical rituals associated with our loved ones' passing. The clergy and other church ministers at these rituals are also involved. We need to remember, that when one passes away, the whole parish community is involved as well, with their prayers, words of sympathy, and presence to the family in various ways. Furthermore, those who dig the graves and maintain the cemetery property are also a significant part of this ministry. A ministry which involves so many of us, a ministry of care and concern, a ministry of being the compassionate Christ at one of our most vulnerable times in our lives: losing a loved one.

As your pastor, I am assuming full responsibility for the long time it has taken us to ensure that what is described above becomes a reality. We needed to make changes in the cemetery maintenance beginning with a year ago in January 2009. Since January 2009, we tried several ways to replace the service that existed for many generations. Some things worked out, some did not. I need to thank all those who were part of this process last year. We are presently attempting to ensure that the ministry of "burying the dead" becomes truly a ministry of our parish community. I empathize with those of you who have been frustrated and impatient in this matter. So have I! I also support and am grateful for those of you who been patient. Thank you. Fr. Paul, ofm

We will have the traditional Memorial Day Mass at the cemetery on Monday, May 31st at 7:30 a.m.
