Musings from the Pastoral Center

Welcome him as you would me

My wife Wendy has been a college professor for nearly 20 years. During those years she has had many special students that she has mentored—college students away from home, on their own, especially torn between the past, present and future of their lives. These students are attracted to her as a role model, an example, a listener, not a judge. She can neither impart riches, power, nor open doors to worldly success. She cannot spoil them like a doting parent. She only offers herself, her convictions, her compassion, her example. And they seek her wisdom, instruction, counsel, advice. She listens and they listen. They become almost like children, but loyal children, obedient children. They take up the challenge to better themselves, apply themselves, to learn more than just facts and theories. And when the time comes to graduate, they need letters. So Wendy writes letters and uses all the influence she can muster to get her academic children off to promising starts for their careers.

There is a close parallel here with Paul's letter to Philemon concerning his run-away slave Onesimus, who has been serving Paul while he is in prison. Philemon is a wealthy Christian in one of Paul's churches. Paul has mentored this young man, and he has become a brother in Christ. Now, Onesimus is ready to go back into the world and Paul writes the world's best letter of recommendation. Literally Paul asks Philemon to accept Onesimus as he would himself—a brother in Christ. That letter was apparently effective. Tradition tells us that Onesimus ("useful one" in Greek) became a bishop of one of Paul's churches.

Persons come to us to learn about our faith. All you can offer is your convictions, compassion, and example. They seek our wisdom, instruction, and counsel. They listen and you listen. We walk with them on a journey of faith and discovery. They become our children, our brothers and sisters in Christ. We become a family, bound by cords of love, interdependent, unified in spirit and life. Your reaching out to mentor as Paul did with Onesimus builds up the body of Christ, the church.
