Musings from the Pastoral Center by Deacon Clarence

As I prepared for my ordination these past couple of weeks, I have been reflecting on the events of my life that have led me on the path to the permanent diaconate. For me, this has been a journey of about 25 years. I first considered becoming a deacon in the mid-1980's. Kaye and I discussed what would be required, not only of me, but of her and our family. At that time, we had been married less than 10 years and our youngest two children had not yet been born. We decided that my primary obligation was to our growing family, and that was not the time for me to become a deacon.

However, the thought of becoming a deacon persisted. At times, it was a strong desire. But there were also plenty of times when I wondered why on earth God would be calling me, of all people. I just didn't know if I was deacon material and I wondered how I would know for sure. I thought maybe I needed to be "knocked off my horse on the road to Damascus," as St. Paul was, a clear indication that this is what God wanted me to do.

When my good friend, Bill Holzhaeuser entered the diaconate program, I was almost a little jealous. I wondered how he could make that decision, while I was having difficulty taking the next step.

I guess the Lord decided I did need to be knocked off my horse and that experience happened on a Saturday in January of 2006. I was scheduled to read at 6:00 Mass, but my son, Brian, had an out-of-town hockey game late that afternoon. I could not find a substitute so I stayed behind to read at Mass.

The reading was from the 1st Book of Samuel. Samuel hears someone calling him in his sleep and thinks it is Eli. Finally, Eli tells Samuel that the next time it happens, he should say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." But what really knocked me off my horse that evening was Fr. Frank Folino's homily. He spoke about his lifelong desire to be a priest, but when he reached his 40's, he still hadn't done anything about it. He decided he didn't want to someday be 80 years old and think, "I really wanted to be a priest." Throughout his homily, but particularly when Fr. Frank said those words, I felt he was speaking directly to me. I realized then that, I too, didn't want to be 80 years old and wish that I had become a deacon.

All the circumstances of that day – my inability to find a substitute, the reading from 1st Samuel, and Fr. Frank's homily – told me quite clearly that the Lord wanted me to be at that Mass on that day, to let me know that it was time to take the next step.

The Lord has a plan for each one of us. His plan unfolds before us in His time, not ours. We simply need to be attentive, recognize it, and act upon it. How is God calling you to be a service to Him and His people?
