Musings from the Pastoral Center by Fr. Paul

In last Sunday's readings, we responded to the Book of Proverbs with Psalm 128. This psalm, a poem, affirms the faith that one has in God will be blessed in those who show reverence to God. The phrase, "who fears the Lord" appears in the first reading as well as in the psalm response. To fear the Lord, as we have come to know, does not mean to crouch down low, shake in timidity, and become anxious concerning how God will treat us. To fear the Lord is to stand in awesomeness of God's grandeur, goodness, and compassion. It is to live a way of life in which God is above all. Only this type of God has to be above all, since other gods and we as humans have proven to be mortal. But not so with the God of Sarah and Abraham, Mariam and Moses, Rachel and Jacob, and ourselves as well. This is a "holy fear" of God which we come to develop in reverence.

This holy fear of God is manifested in the blessings of a way of life found in a family setting: the domestic family in the home, the family of the faith community, the family of nations. The rewards of a just life in the Lord are compared to a fruitful reaping of the work of one's hands, a household kept faithful and comforting through the endeavors of one's wife, children surrounding the table like olive shoots, and the promise of seeing one's children's children. This poem of accepting the ways of the Lord also mentions the blessings which come from Zion "all the days of [one's] life."

During these last Sundays of the Church calendar, there is an emphasis on the end of our lives and the inevitable process of death. In the ritual of our Baptisms, we die with Christ so as to rise with Him in the Resurrection. The in-between times of our lives here on earth is the gift God gives us to live in "the holy fear of the Lord." To "walk in [God's] ways:" is to walk in the realities of our lives which become in the awesomeness of God.

Catholic Order of Foresters: Thank you for your support of our parish! I reported in last week's bulletin that the \$1500 donation that was given to the 2010 Holiday Bazaar last year was not given this year – in 2011. This is because their 2011 \$1500 gift had already been donated - in spring 2011 - to the parish. We received it early this year! The Order helped our parish in a time of financial need, and we sincerely appreciated the COF generosity.

Our new Parish Center Steps are now installed. Thank you to Dan and Jeff Kupczyk, Dave Bichanich, and Kramolis Concrete for your hard work on this project. The steps look terrific – plus, the main benefit is that we now have a safe (not crumbling) and level (not a trip hazard anymore) set of steps in which to enter the parish office. It's wonderful. Although this was not a budgeted expenditure, the funds for this project were approved by the finance council from the renovation fund. The total project cost, including parts, labor, concrete, demolition and building was approximately \$3200. Some donations to help pay for the project have been received so far, but if you would like to further assist, we would be very appreciative.

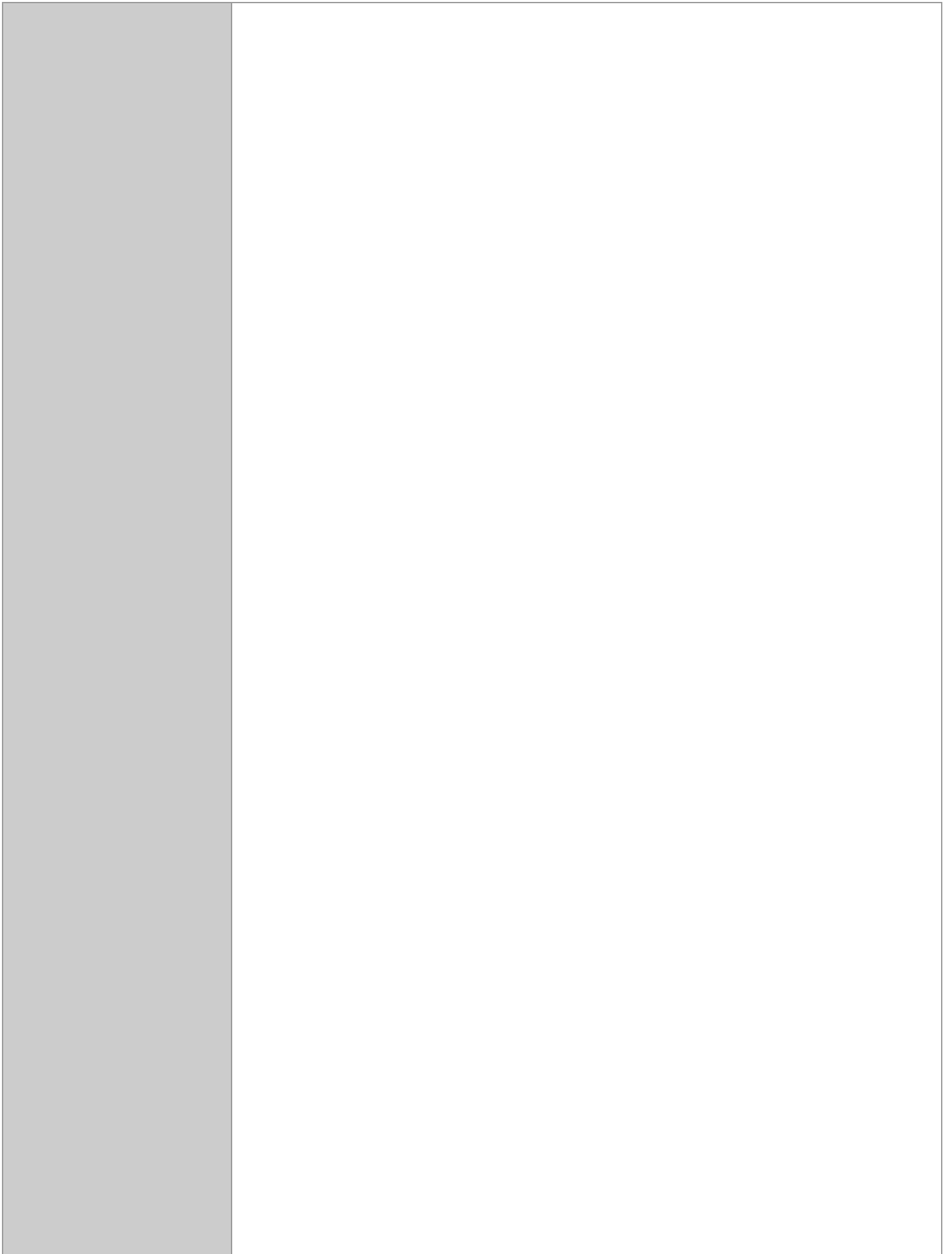

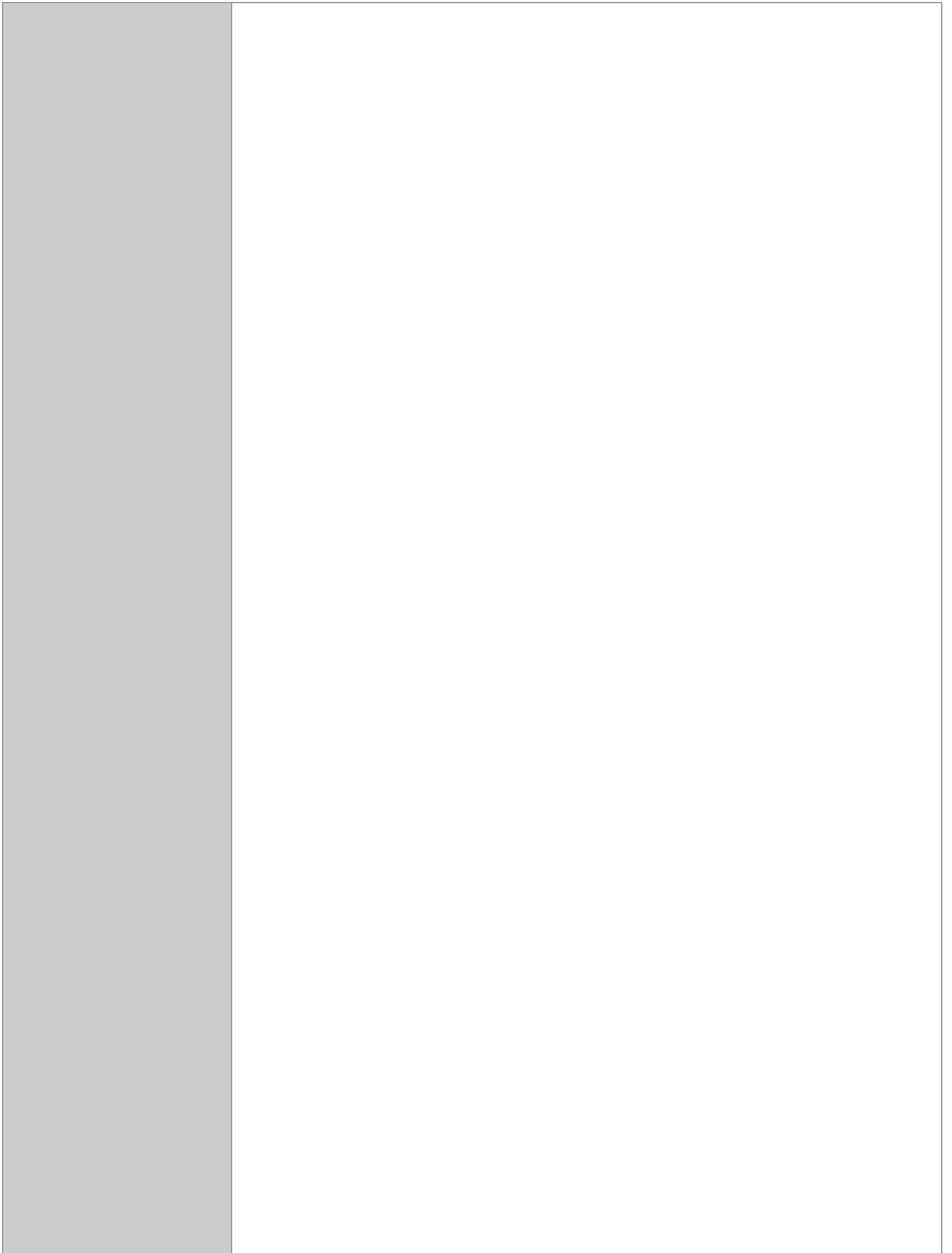
