Musings from the Pastoral Center

In each of our lives I believe that we all seek peace and security. What are the keys that can give you true peace and security? In our gospel this weekend Peter is given the keys to the kingdom of God. The keys to the kingdom of God lead one to true peace and security. How does he come to receive these keys? First he becomes a friend of Jesus. As Peter experiences a relationship with Jesus, God touches his life with a deeper reality of who Jesus is. So much so that Peter can acknowledge and accept that Jesus is Lord of His life. In accepting Jesus as friend and Lord of his life Peter unlocks the doors to God's kingdom. But in receiving the keys to enter into God's Kingdom Peter takes on a responsibility to care for God's people and share Jesus friendship with the rest of the world. From a worldly perspective there is a cost. For Peter, who lived his life for God's people, it was not always easy. He was persecuted, placed in jail and hung upside down on a cross.

So what are the keys that can bring us peace and security? In Baptism we have been given the opportunity to be a child of God. We are called to become a friend of Jesus'. To become a true friend takes; loyalty, faithfulness and love. And like Peter in friendship, we can grow to acknowledge and accept Jesus as Lord of our lives. We come to a profound love where the doors of God Kingdom are unlocked for us. We are called to take on the responsibility of living our lives not for ourselves, but in the service of God's people. This may mean sacrifice and leaving behind our own wants and desires. And it may mean that we may not be accepted, because we are loyal and faithful to God's way and not the world. If we want true peace and security, then I believe we must pay the price to nurture a profound relationship with the Lord. If we do, we will be given the keys to God's Kingdom and experience true peace and security.
