**Musings from the Pastoral Center** by Deacon Bill

August is letting go month for the Holzhaeusers. This weekend Mary Jo and I are taking Joanna to St. Norbert College for the start of her senior year of College. Letting go. Two weekends ago our son, Wilson, left for New York to begin law school at New York Law School in Manhattan. Another letting go.

But I wonder, isn't life a series of 'letting go' events? It was a short twenty-three years ago when I first dropped Wilson off at Little Tykes Day Care Center for the first time. That was not easy even knowing the great care he would receive. Letting go of the bicycle - and watching a potential crash against the pavement become reality. Not to mention the first time they got into the automobile by themselves. Letting go. School begins and parents all over the world are letting go.

Letting go is not just about parents and children. All of us let go of things in our lives. I recall the time my dad gave up his driver's license. I hear my patients tell me how difficult it is to sell their homestead after many years. And then there is retirement. Another letting go.

Letting go, however, provides opportunities. It provides an opportunity to trust in God. To seek understand through prayer. We all grow because we learn to trust in God. We learn about faith.

Mary Jo and I pray every day for God to protect our children. (Our oldest is in New York, remember). All parents pray for their children. And when it is time to really let go - whether it is a bicycle, a car, school, retirement, or being married to somebody else's child - trusting in God and His care is a great comfort.
