Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Musings from the Pastoral Center by Fr. Paul

The Beatitudes found in Matthew are very well known. There is a similar version found in Luke as well (6: 20-23). They are written in a literary form found in the Wisdom literature of the Old Testament. This form of writing was created in order to explain the best way to live in this world. The concept of life after death was not part of Jewish way of thinking at that time.

Simply put, it followed the theory of justification: the good were rewarded and the bad were punished. This applied to all aspects of one's life: health, possessions, prosperity, having children, position in the community, etc. Job is a fine example of this theory in practice. He was blessed with an abundance of all good and more in his life. It was taken away from him leading his friends to wonder and accuse him of becoming evil. When this was not evident, his family and friends resorted to ridiculing him for his faith in God, which he maintained as the only good in his life.

Placing this way of thinking within New Testament literature, especially as a parable, there is a significant change in the way of thinking for a Christian. Being poor, mourning, hungry and thirsty, persecuted and reviled are not due to an evil way of life. These states in life are a reality we have all been associated with in some way. At the same time, being meek, merciful, pure of heart, and peaceful are not necessarily the results of living a good life. "...for even the pagans are found to be this way..." (Matt 5: 47). Like Job, we come to learn that no matter which state of life we live or find ourselves in, we are all powerless and dependent upon God for what we have or do not have.
