Feast of Pentecost

Musings from the Pastoral Center - Deacon Owen

Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.

Today we celebrate the closing of the Easter season with Pentecost. On this day we celebrate the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, "who will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." Throughout the Easter season we have relived the experiences of the disciples awaiting that coming. Jesus has risen, Jesus has ascended, now we await the arrival of the Holy Spirit, to enlighten us with the truth of living the Gospel. This is a Spirit that will bring Jesus back into our very hearts and minds: A Spirit that will guide us in living a life of blessing God and others.

During the 40 days of the post-resurrection, the disciples said they believed that Jesus is the Christ, but Jesus tells them they believe what they can see, touch, and feel. When Jesus entered his passion and death, they scattered and abandoned their belief. Their faith was weak. Jesus knew that only the Holy Spirit would give them the faith, the strength to believe. So, he promised to send the "Spirit of truth." Jesus assured his disciples that despite the troubles they will face in the world, he will be with them in Spirit and encourage them. This is because Jesus has conquered sin and death to bring about life, life as God intended for us to live.

And what an event when that Spirit came! The disciples were gathered together praying for Christ's Spirit to come. Then, swirling winds and tongues of fire! The people gathered could hear the Gospel proclaimed in their native tongue! They were all witnessing the birth of Christ's church: a church of unity, a church of one Spirit, a church that witnesses the presence of risen Christ among us. This was a church that included all humanity: a church that is the Body of Christ.

We too are called into Christ's church. We are called to come together and pray for the Spirit to come to us, a Spirit of unity, a Spirit of truth. This Spirit will assure us that we will find Christ's presence in us and in the flesh and blood of others who reach out as Jesus did. Then we will experience the Spirit of peace.

Today's 2nd Reading

Solemnity of Pentecost - Week of June 12, 2011

As you hear this reading, what single line from Saint Paul touches your heart? What is there in this reading that really speaks to your soul?

Theme: We have been given the breath of God - the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Question for Children: When have you heard your inner voice or conscience guiding you to do what is right?

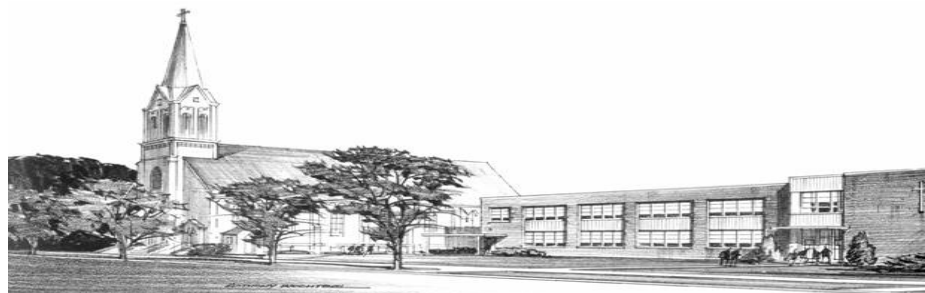
