Third Sunday of Lent

Musings from the Pastoral Center by Fr. Paul

Jesus arrives at Jacob's well, hungry, thirsty, and tired. The evangelist John always emphasizes Jesus' full humanity. We remember that John's gospel begins with: "the Word became flesh" (1:14). He meets the Samaritan woman at the well, another human created by God the Father. They interact due to Jesus' prompting. Jesus has no problem asking for a drink from the woman for she has the bucket for retrieving water and provide him with satisfaction for his thirst. Jesus has crossed the boundaries of gender, race, and religion. It is no wonder the woman is surprised by both his request and the fact that he would speak to her. He desires to engage in dialogue and is depending upon her kindness. Both persons are in a vulnerable position.

Jesus takes a risk in speaking to this woman. Jesus takes the interaction to another level. One beyond the flesh, beyond the element of water, beyond human boundaries established over centuries of custom and decorum. "If you only knew whom you were speaking to and the living water I am able to give to you." The same Person who turned water into wine, now offers the Water of Life. The best wine is kept for the end at the wedding of Cana. The best water comes not from the well of Jacob, but from the God who desires to be united with us forever: "spring of water welling up to eternal life." The best water becomes life eternal.

As our Lenten journey continues, God interacts with us through the Son, Jesus Christ. And Jesus takes a risk with us as well. Is our fasting one of letting go of our thirsts for the worldly drinks of self-satisfaction or does our fasting fills us with God's living water of grace? Is our alms giving directed to our favorite causes, only those whom we know or come to know or does our almsgiving cross the boundaries of social customs, conventions, prejudices and hostilities?

Whole Community Catechesis

March 27 – April 2, 2011, Third Sunday of Lent

Gospel: John 4: 5-42

Theme: Whoever drinks the water I give, will never thirst again.

Question for Adults: When you are tempted to try to satisfy your "thirst for meaning" through some other means, what keeps you coming back to the living water of intimacy with Christ? Through what means do you experience Christ's power in your life: sacraments? Scripture? prayer? others?

Question for Youth: Share about a time in your own life when you experienced the power of Christ guiding and strengthening you, especially as you grow into young adulthood, facing the range of options before you in life.

Question for Children: How do you experience Jesus helping and loving you?

We, too, must be ready to respond whenever and wherever the Lord speaks to us and be prepared for it to change our lives!

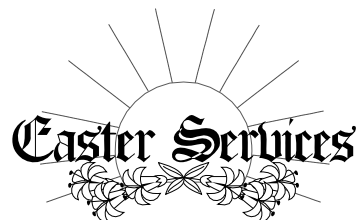
